



THE OFFICE OF RESEARCH ADMINISTRATION

Externally sponsored grants and contracts enhance the capacity for the University to achieve its mission through education, research, and service projects. Moreover, external funding enables faculty and staff to address the needs of communities, schools, and businesses throughout southwest Missouri and beyond.

In 2013-2014, Missouri State University was awarded \$21,948,927 to support projects in research, education and service. The funding represents a 9 percent increase from what was collected in 2012-2013. We have managed to increase funding from nearly every source, most notable was an increase of 39% from business entities during FY 2014.

SPONSORED FUNDING FOR FISCAL YEAR 2014

The University’s sponsored program activity for FY 2014 showed total requested (\$33,555,223) and awarded (\$21,948,927) funds, for which the funds awarded was a 9% increase from FY 2013 for the institution. There were 135 named investigators with 289 awards received.

Federal agencies continue to be the leading source of grants and contracts, with a funding increase of 5% from the previous year. The University was able to increase its service work, funded from various business entities, which increased by 39% this fiscal year.

Four of the academic colleges, Business, Education, Health & Human Services, Natural & Applied Sciences, the Research & Economic Development Division, the School of Agriculture, and the West Plains campus all exceeded \$1 million in annual award funding. The West Plains campus led the way as they received awards totaling \$2,953,874 during FY 2014.

University Centers continue to be instrumental in acquiring external funding with approximately 28% of the total funds awarded in FY 2014. University Centers brought in a total of \$6,111,290 of external funding for the year. The Southwest Regional Professional Development Center was the leader in obtaining funding amongst the Centers, obtaining over \$1 million in external funding for FY 2014.
