

## THE OFFICE OF SPONSORED RESEARCH & PROGRAMS

Externally sponsored grants and contracts enhance the capacity for the University to achieve its mission through education, research, and service projects. Moreover, external funding enables faculty and staff to address the needs of communities, schools and businesses throughout southwest Missouri and beyond.

In 2012-2013, Missouri State University was awarded \$20,188,675 to support projects in research, education and service. The funding represents a 6 percent increase from what was collected in 2011-2012. We were expecting a continued decrease in funding due to continued budget decreases from our Federal funding sources (represented later in this report). However, we managed to increase both Federal and State Funding. The focus this year was on obtaining funding for educational projects, and it did seem to pay off with an increase in funding of 38%.

## **SPONSORED FUNDING FOR FISCAL YEAR 2013**

The University's sponsored program activity for FY 2013 showed total requested (\$32,939,082) and awarded (\$20,188,675) funds, for which the funds awarded was a 6% increase from FY 2012 for the institution. There were 138 named investigators with 289 awards received.

Federal agencies continue to be the leading source of grants and contracts, with a funding increase of 21% from the previous year. The University was able to increase its service work, funded from various external sources (Other), which increased by 33% this fiscal year.

FY 2013 showed a significant increase in funding for Education of 38%, while most other project types decreased. Facilities & Infrastructure continues to increase due to JVIC and improvement projects running through Design & Construction.

University Centers continue to be instrumental in acquiring external funding with approximately 30% of the total funds awarded in FY 2013. University Centers brought in a total of \$6,052,467 of external funding for the year. The Mid-America Viticulture and Enology Center and the Southwest Regional Professional Development Center were the leaders in obtaining funding amongst the Centers, both obtaining over \$1 million in external funding for FY 2013.
