What is Human Research at Missouri State?

When students, staff, and/or faculty conduct research at Missouri State University that involves human participants, an application to the Institutional Review Board (IRB) is required by University policy.

Research is defined as a systematic investigation, including research development, testing and evaluation, designed to develop or contribute to generalizable knowledge (45 CFR 46).

While it may seem obvious, you have to be working with "human participants" to necessitate an application to the IRB. A Human Participant is defined as living individual(s) about whom an investigator (whether professional or student) conducting research obtains:

- 1. data through intervention or interaction with the individual, or
- 2. identifiable private information

Thus, if you are conducting research by working with human participants, then you should complete and submit an IRB application. For more information, please see IRB Policy & Procedure.
